Bartlett Regional Hospital Selects Summit All Access to Meet CMS Conditions of Participation (CoP) on ADT Alerts

The Need

Bartlett Regional Hospital needed to find a solution to meet the CMS Conditions of Participation (CoP) requiring hospitals to send e-notifications to providers. This rule goes into effect on May 1, 2021, after being extended due to COVID-19. For CMS CoP, healthcare facilities who participate in CMS including Critical Access Hospitals (CAHs) and Psychiatric Hospitals will need to implement a solution to enable e-notifications for admissions, discharges, or transfers to another facility or from outpatients to inpatients, for the purpose of treatment, care coordination, and/or quality improvement.

The Cost

- Failure to meet the new CMS requirements will result in loss of certifications and reimbursements. Facilities must show they are sending e-notifications to 10% of their average daily census and not less than 30 records to be compliant.
- The Joint Commission found that 80% of all serious medical errors involve delayed communication, lack of PCP awareness of a patient event, or miscommunication during care transitions to different care settings.
- It is estimated that faxing, scanning and even courier services (which are insecure, and cost, resource, and time intensive), cost the healthcare industry \$250 billion annually.

The Solution
